<b>CURBSIDE RECYCLING:</b>	<b>NO:</b>
 <p><b>Plastics Containers #1-5:</b> Bottles and Containers, Rinsed, Lids OK off of bottles.</p>	<p>Bags, #6 which is Polystyrene (aka Styrofoam), Films, Wraps, Buckets, Motor oil or other hazardous material containers, Large items.</p>
 <p><b>Food &amp; Drink Cans:</b> Aluminum/Steel/Tin Cans, Aluminum foil and Disposable pie tins, Rinsed, Minimal food contamination.</p>	<p>Aerosol cans, Propane bottles, Paint buckets, Metal pots, Cookie sheets, Large metal.</p>
 <p><b>Mixed Paper:</b> Newspaper(clean); Printer paper; Copier paper</p>	<p>Packing paper; Fluorescent color papers; Corrugated cardboard; Wax-coated paper such as milk/juice cartons; Spiral or bound papers; Books. Junk mail; Magazines and Catalogs (glue- and staple-back); Cereal boxes; colored and glossy paper; Paper bags; Paper 6-pack holder; Paper egg cartons; Papertowel holder tubes; Phone books.</p>

	 <p><b>Corrugated Cardboard</b> (Flattened)</p> <p>Food contaminated cardboard; Waxed cardboard.</p>
